Priority 1	Focused small group interventions and support during whole group teaching with TAs to close the gap for disadvantaged pupils created through COVID-19 school closures.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Additional intervention support seeks to address inequalities in learning experienced by children who are entitled to PP funding.

Projected spending	<p>£18,830 (14 pupils x £1,345 each) = 115 hours of TA support.</p> <p>This equates to 3 hours per week of focussed intervention time per small group / 1:1 or TA support in class based activities / whole class teaching per yer group.</p>
